## Addendum to Schools' Equality Objectives during school closures because of Covid-19

St James Church of England Primary School aims to achieve Equity and Excellence for ALL children in ALL schools recognising its duties under the Equality Act 2010. However, during this challenging time of school closures, the realisation of meeting the objectives of this duty need specific review with some common aims across our schools to meet our general duties during the extended period of distance learning. In considering school policy addendums, and activities such as Curriculum review for distance learning, and our engagement with families isolated at home, we will consider our legal obligations to have due regard to this act in these exceptional circumstances.

Our schools' general duties, with regards to equality are:

- Eliminate discrimination and other conduct that is prohibited by the Act,
- Advance equality of opportunity between people who share a protected characteristic and people who do not share it,
- Foster good relations across all characteristics between people who share a protected characteristic and people who do not share it.
